

2025 PARKES CORVETTE NATIONALS.

The '25 Corvette Nationals was the turn of the NSW Corvettes Unlimited Club, who made the decision to hold the event at the regional town of Parkes due to the recent floods causing some economic devastation. It was hoped that the Nationals would in some small way give a boost to the town.

A couple of club members headed off early, the McBride's to Sydney and Alan and Dale heading off early so as not to tax the C3 or themselves.

6 cars met up at Tailem Bend on the Thursday morning, Prez/1st Lady, the McPhee's, Tim, Val and Hans, the Wombats and a W.A. member that we managed to find somewhere. Yes we were running a little behind, but that drive diagonally across Adelaide in the morning traffic was a giant pain, we don't want to do that again.

Our first segment was to Ouyen, Victoria for lunch stop. This was our go to lunch stop last year for the Canberra run. We decided to top up fuel at the self serve (i.e. no shop or attendant) servo on the corner near the café. Well, bugger me, the pumps were on a 'go slow', maybe they were CFMEU members who hadn't been paid off. After a considerable amount of time I managed to get 7 litres into McGarrett and the others didn't fare much better. Time to get out of there.

We were off to Hay, New South Wales for our overnight stop. We rumbled into town, found our motel and proceeded to have a staff meeting with refreshments. 












36th Corvette Nationals SUNSHINE COAST AUSTRALIA 2026

KERNEWEK LOWENDER also know as the "Copper Coast Cornish Festival" By Alan Litchfield

This is not an official club run, but I'm going, and if anyone wants to join me, have a read below. Every 2 years, they hold the "Classic Cavalcade of Cars" and this year, it's to be held on Sunday, 18th May.

Last time, in 2023, 8 other Corvettes (and a Capri) followed me over.

It's open for vehicles built in 1995 or earlier.

After departing the START at the Wallaroo Marshalling Yard, the Cavalcade will travel from Wallaroo thru to Moonta and Port Hughes, then finishing at the Kadina Oval for public display.

It's like driving thru a Xmas pageant with the streets lined with thousands of people.

Food/drinks and Cornish pasties are available on the oval at the finish.

They get 600+ cars. I don't want to be at the end of the line, so we need to get there early-ish.

I will be meeting at OTR at Boliver at 6:30AM for a 6:45AM departure.

Depending on road works, it's about 1-3/4hr drive to the start, (with a quick Jimmy stop at Pt Wakefield if required.)

This year there's no entry forms. Just rock up and pay the entry fee of \$50.00 at the gate.




